Chapter Policies San Angelo Chapter TASO – Football

- 1) You are responsible for your assigned game schedule.
- 2) The Referee is the crew chief. You are responsible for contacting him at least three days prior to the game day. Referee must verify with Secretary that crew is available at least three days prior to game day. Travel arrangements, uniforms, etc. are the Referee's decision.
- 3) The Secretary must approve all varsity substitutions. Sub-varsity substitutions may be made at the discretion of the Referee of the game but should be reported to the Secretary.
- 4) If you are dressed in any part of your uniform, you represent the San Angelo Chapter TASO Football. Conduct yourself according to all policies.
- 5) Casual dress to and from ball games is acceptable. No shorts, tank tops, collarless shirts, sandals, or any other items not appropriate as business casual. Colors of teams should be considered in your selection of dress.
- 6) Game uniforms must be neat. Uniforms must meet TASO Football Officials Mechanics Manual standards. Jewelry other than wedding bands and watches is prohibited.
- 7) Regulated items by U.I.L. rules and State Laws
 - A. Alcohol Never to be used on game day. Remember the open container law while driving to and from contests. Never bring an open container onto State Regulated property. This includes ASU facilities.
 - B. Medication Make Referee aware of any medications that might alter one's abilities to officiate or be perceived as alcohol.
 - C. Tobacco Products Use is prohibited on any State Regulated property. This includes ASU facilities.
- 8) Conduct of an official before, during, and after a game should be strictly professional. All conversations with anyone before, during, or after a game should be limited and professional.
- 9) All reporting of incidents must adhere strictly to the TASO Football reporting procedure.
- 10) Monetary consideration should be made to the driver if refreshments are provided.
- 11) I will provide the San Angelo TASO Football Chapter Board notice of any misdemeanor or felony arrest or charge within 48 hours of said incident. This does not include traffic code violations.
